Who's Who in the Congress Mr. James C. Collins Keynote Speaker

James C. Collins, Jr. vice president and general manager – DuPont Crop Protection was born in 1962, and studied at Christian Brothers College in Memphis, Tenn., and received his B.S. in Chemical Engineering. He also received his MBA from the



University of Delaware in Marketing with a focus on International Business.

e began his career in 1984 in DuPont Manufacturing. He had various assignments at the Memphis, Savannah River, Charlotte, and

Mobile plants in engineering, supervision, and business management. In 1993, Mr. Collins moved to Wilmington, Del., working in the Ag Sales & Marketing Group as a product manager, a distribution project leader, and as the farmer offering manager. In 1997, he moved to Belle, W.Va., where he served as site manager for the Crop Protection Products production facilities.

In 1999, he moved to St. Louis where he was involved in the DuPont acquisition of Protein Technologies International (PTI) and Pioneer Hi-Bred International. He held positions as director, identity preservation programs and director, Meat/Food – Industry Management. He returned to Crop Protection as director – Specialty Grains Programs where he worked for the overall Ag Enterprise responsible for Identity Preserved Grain projects and helping to develop future value added grain contracting.

Mr. Collins transferred to Hong Kong as the regional business director – Asia Pacific for DuPont Crop Protection and Pioneer and brought all of the elements of the seed and Crop Protection businesses together to support production agriculture in the Asia Pacific Region. He was named global sales director for Crop Protection in November 2002. He was named to his current position in January 2004. He serves on CropLife International's Crop Protection Strategy Council.

Outreach Campaign

Since 2003, Japan Crop Protection Association (JCPA) has conducted one unique program to communicate with public in order to solve misunderstanding about the risk of pesticides. Consumers changed drastically their opinion after attending this seminar. The results of this trial are summarized by Prof. Motoyama (Chiba Univ.). He has participated in the Outreach Campaign from the beginning as one of the lecturers.

Luncheon Seminar-3 (Room 403) Sponsor: Battelle AgriFood Registration & Commercialization of Agrochemicals in Europe

Battelle is a Swiss company, and this seminar consists of two topics. Dr. Weidenauer will introduce the complex registration situation of agrochemicals in Europe. Next, Dr. Bell will explain the Life Cycle Management by formulation strategy.

➤ Luncheon Seminar-4 (Room 501) Sponsor: USDA/IR-4 Project Specialty Crop Program and the IR-4

Crop protection using pest control products is the key components in specialty crops. But Agchem manufacturers had have little interest in getting the registration for these crops due to rather small sales. The IR-4 project was started in 1963 in the USA, and has been a highly successful model program in residue data packages. The possible global solutions for residue studies will be discussed in this seminar.

Luncheon Seminar-5 (Room 502) Sponsor: Nippon Soda Specialty of Nisso Chemical Analysis Services (NCAS) - qualitative and quantitative analyses of trace amounts of ingredients in complex matrices

NCAS was the first analytical company in Japan to acquire OECD GLP approval, and now holds 3 GLP certificates. In this seminar, the analytical policy of NCAS will be introduced using several pesticide analyses as examples.
